# February 2021 Construction Summary Report

The last of the site utilities that interfered with the foundation for the Phase 1 Addition were transferred over to the relocated infrastructure on Jan. 18th. This was achieved while the preschool was closed for the National Day of Service/MLK Birthday. Now that the utilities were removed, Cohorst was able to prepare the final area of the new addition for engineered fill and installation of foundations. This preparation which consisted of layering the earth fill in 8-12 lifts; which were compacted, inspected, and tested to confirm density (completed around Feb. 5<sup>th</sup>). Then winter hit.... from February 7<sup>th</sup> through 16<sup>th</sup>, we were in a deep freeze with snow and the low temperatures reaching -13 degrees. This prevented the installation of the LVC engineered fill, due to near 1.5 feet of frost in the subgrade. Some progress was made during this time, removal of the emergency exit stair structure, which interfered with the connection bridge, hallway, and fire stair between the existing facility and the new addition. Relocation of 5 of the condenser units were completed as well as removal of the existing concrete slab in this area. Additionally, Cohorst continued work on the storm water system by installing the structures at the city storm sewer main in the verge at Black Bob Road at the northwest corner of the site, the discharge structure to the city main and the inlet structure from the parking lot area near the new Maintenance Building and dumpster area. Yes, the rock is still there and required a lot of effort to excavate. The final week of February we began to receive the building steel, steel deck, and roof components which will be stored in the southeast corner of the parking lot (area is blocked off with orange cones and signage). We also reconnected the electrical power to the relocated condensers and made preparation for the erection of the emergency exit stair and the foundations for the Phase 1 Addition. Spring will come with our Lord's blessings. Thanks be to God.

## Goals for March:

- Completion of the subgrade and LVC fill work for Phase 1 Addition and Maintenance Building.
- Mobilize BC Hardscape, LLC and Bottorff Construction, Inc. for retaining wall and concrete scope including the interconnection foundations, Phase 1 Addition foundations and the Maintenance Building slab.
- Continue mass grading for, retaining wall, parking lots, and storm water detention structure.
- Addition of Mark Fintel, Laborers for Christ, to prepare for work to be executed by BSLCKS and LFC volunteers, which is the Maintenance Building above grade work and available interior work of the Phase 1 Addition.
- Tie-in to the city water main at the south and east side of property which completes the water main work. Once foundations are in place rough-in to building will be completed.
- Receive and store steel deliveries.
- Erection of the Emergency Exit Stair.
- Continue re-bidding of remainder of contractors, equipment, and material suppliers for the project.
- Refine project schedule for the remainder of the project now that known uncontrolled impediments to progress have been address. Now, we only have to address the unknown ones.
