LWML Kansas District Convention

At the LWML Kansas District convention, voters selected the mission grants and committed to fund \$43,000 in mission grants and \$40,000 in Student Financial Aid in the next two years. \$5200 from a Mission Grant Endowment Fund will provide additional support! God's Gracious Gift Fund recipients were also chosen. \$22,034 for those will be paid out in the next few weeks.

MISSIONS

HYGIENE KITS for ORPHAN GRAIN TRAIN

Orphan Grain Train has been helping provide humanitarian aid donations for the Ukrainian refugees. Our hygiene kits will help replenish their supplies. The **TOWEL TOWER** has been set up in the narthex. We are collecting **light-weight**, **dark-colored**, **regular-sized bath towels** (no oversized) and washcloths. Other items to be added are: single-packaged toothbrushes, nail clippers, and bath-size bars of soap.

Our goal is 50 kits, but we will assemble as many kits as possible with incoming donations. We have 46 towels and washcloths, 24 soap, 22 single packaged toothbrushes and 8 nail clippers so far.

If you would like to donate but don't want to shop, envelopes will be available for cash donations. Envelopes can be put in the small, locked, wooden donation box on top of the large wooden box. Questions, contact Charlotte Hundley.
