September Summary Report

What a month.... we finally have some dry weather and as stated last month the site did "become a bee hive of activity". The construction process will now morph from parallel activities; which allows several activities to be executed independently and concurrently to more series of executions that is dependent on predecessors being completed, therefore the communication coordination and collaboration is all the more important. Additionally, thus far our early and preemptive procurement of materials and contracts has mitigated some the supply chain issues due to COVID and labor shortages. Yet some supply issues are beginning to appear, we are being proactive as possible.

The standing seam roofing panel install continued into September. Not having a dried in roof caused several days of squeegeeing water out of the building to allow interior work to commence. KD Christian completed the exterior wall and porch work as much as possible while making excellent progress on interior wall stud. The completion of the interior wall studding allowed the plumbing, mechanical, and electrical contractors to install the first floor rough-in work and receive approval from the City of Olathe to proceed with hanging the drywall on 1st floor. Roof panel installation was completed early in September allowing rake, eave trim, gutter, and downspout work to also be completed in September, with soffit installation and porch roof remaining to be completed following the masonry work on the West elevation. Storm water infrastructure installation was completed in September allowing the removal of rock spoils and segregation of clean fill and top soil. Staking for parking lot subgrade, grading and coordination with paving contractor has been scheduled for October. 2nd week of September the Exterior Insulating Finish System (EFIS) was the commencement of the finish coats and was completed in the following two weeks for the major portion of the building, only the porch structure remains and should be completed in October as well. During the 3rd week the Main Electrical Switch Gear was received and install on its housekeeping pad on the east side of the North stairwell. During this same week major progress was made on the retaining wall.

During the 4th week, Nancy and I were on hiatus to celebrate my 68th Birthday and our 49th Wedding Anniversary, 9/15 through 9/25. Mike Crane and the BSLC Volunteers lead/coordinated by Roger Berardi maintained the progress with clearing, cleaning, installation of blocking in walls, preparing for paint etc. Beautiful Savior Lutheran Church's volunteers are unequalled in enthusiasm, skills production, and quality. It is a challenge to keep ahead of their progress. The contractors are also impressed and challenged to get their work done so we are able to do what is possible to be done by these volunteers.

We had scheduled the setting of the HVAC (heating, ventilation, and air conditioning) unit for 9/20, however due to rain the night before this required rescheduling to 9/27 when we set all four (4) units on their concrete pedestals on the East side of the building. These units are currently being readied for connections to the building, duct systems and to be energized and commissioned, hopefully in October or early November. Bell Masonry mobilize and commenced executing the brick masonry on the West elevation.

Also accomplished this month, Trifecta Construction completed window installation, set the framing for the exterior entry, Excel Plastering caulked all the windows, and demobilized, until the porch structure is

ready for their finishing following the installation of the stone finishes by Bell Masonry. Cohorst Enterprises, Inc. is gearing up to complete the parking lot subgrade, regrade and complete the detention pond, dress out the storm water infrastructure in preparation for Bottorff Construction's site concrete work and Superior Bowen (O'Donnell Asphalt) fine grading of parking lot and asphalt installation in October/November.

We hope to have as SAFE and productive October.... Thanks be to God.

Goals for October:

- Coordination of all the required City of Olathe and Special Inspections required, which will become more frequent and complicated as we move forward. 2nd floor In-wall, Electrical Service, Above Ceiling etc.
- Continue and complete some of the mass grading for, retaining wall, parking lots and storm water control and detention structures. Should be nearing completion during October/early November.
- Complete exterior building trim.
- KD Christian to install 2nd floor interior framing, stock, hang and finish drywall on 2nd floor and prepare for ceiling grid and lay-in ceilings.
- Installation of rough-in for second floor plumbing.
- Installation of structural hangers for HVAC ductwork and lighting fixtures on 2nd Floor
- Sprinkler, testing, inspection, drops to ceiling grid and trim with finish ceilings
- Complete the Electrical, Fire Detection, Data infrastructure, and Security and Access Systems.
- Completion by Bell Masonry for the West Elevation of the Fellowship Building, followed by the masonry work on the Maintenance Building.
- Finish Interior Sheeting and Drywall install in the Maintenance Building
- Receive and install doors of the Maintenance Building, scheduled for receiving walk doors; (10/8) and overhead doors (10/18). Installation to follow.
- Complete retaining wall.
- Coordinate Cohorst, Superior Bowen, and Bottorff Construction for installation of site structures and concrete for completion in October and November.
- Continue bidding of remainder of contractors, equipment and material suppliers for the remainder of project, Cabinets & Counters, Restroom Accessories, Fencing for Retaining Wall and Kitchen Equipment and whatever else we need.
- Refine project schedule for the remainder of the project now that known uncontrolled impediments to progress have been address. We continue to address the unknown ones.
- Coordination of the needed Volunteers for tasks as needed.
- Pray for SAFE project execution, favorable weather and good collaboration as we begin to see the anticipate the finish in 2021.
