BUILDING COMMMITTEE UPDATE

Have you ever wondered why securing a contract takes multiple months to complete? Here's the overall process in a simplified form...

- 1. Pick an item we need a bid for (there are over 150 contracts needed for our project).
- 2. Bid specs put together.
- 3. Tom Hawkins (Project Manager), Dani Olson (Building Committee Chair), and Doug Mahnken (former BSLC President) look over bid specs.
- 4. Our contact at Laborers For Christ (LFC) finds companies in the KC metro we should bid out to.
- 5. Tom, Dani, and Doug review the list of possible companies.
- 6. Changes are sent back to LFC.
- 7. Tom sends out the bid specs to possible companies.
- 8. We wait to hear back from all possible companies.
- 9. Bids are compared. Checking for pricing, scope, addendums, etc.
- 10. The Building Committee decides to go with Company A.
- 11. Tom contacts LFC asking them to make up a contract.
- 12. LFC makes up the contract.
- 13. LFC sends the contract to Tom.
- 14. Tom, Dani, and Doug make sure everything is in the contract.
- 15. Contract goes back to LFC for corrections.
- 16. Contract comes back to Tom, Dani, and Doug
- 17. Tom, Dani, and Doug review the contract again.
- 18. Tom sends the contract to Company A.
- 19. Company A reviews the contract multiple people review it and it takes 1-2 weeks.
- 20. Contract comes back to Tom with changes.
- 21. Tom, Dani, and Doug review changes and agree to move forward or terminate the relationship with Company A. Let's say we keep going...
- 22. Tom sends the contract to LFC.
- 23. LFC makes final changes to the proposed contract.
- 24. Tom, Dani, and Doug do a final review and sign the contract.
- 25. Tom sends the signed contract to Company A.
- 26. Hurray! One bid has been turned a bid into a contract.

Did you read all of those steps? Or did you just skip down to this paragraph? That's the point - the steps needed to have a bid turned into a contract are numerous and the details can be mind - numbing, but Tom Hawkins, Dani Olson, and Doug Mahnken are working diligently to be sure Beautiful Savior's building is of a high standard and quality. It *sounds* like signing a contract should be a simple process until we start to understand the layers of review involved. ANY change/mistake/addition/deletion sends the contract back through multiple reviews. The process isn't bad, but it is time consuming. We want our building to be strong, secure, and safe thus we must take precautions and thorough within every step.
