Summary of Tom Hawkins's (Project Manager) October 2020 Recap submitted to Building Committee: October brought the first signs of activity of Phase 1 construction beginning, including sediment control to protect the work area and storm drainage inlets. The work was completed by Gordon Energy & Drainage. Cohorst Enterprises is ready to begin the land disturbance activities once the Special Storm water Facility Bond and maintenance agreement are completed through the City of Olathe. We expect this to be completed on November 3rd. Finalizing the submission and uploading to the AHJ's system will be completed and hopefully will be in hand by mid-November.

Retired civil engineer and BSLC member, Ron Graybeal, volunteered to construct the entrance stoop and an interior partition inside the job trailer to create a work area and meeting room. Ron will be working with Tom by reviewing construction documents and assuring quality as the construction begins.

Utility companies who serve this site were contacted, met at the site, and determined the desired paths forward for the relocation of new services in accordance with the designs created by PEI Engineering, Inc. and Scharhag Architect. At this point of the project, Evergy has supplied their plan. Google Fiber has provided their routing; which will be executed by Electrical Associates (electrical contractor). Northern Pipeline will be re-routing the gas line and we are in the final negotiations on that effort. Water and sewer service underground will be installed by Cohorst, the building's plumbing and HVAC will be performed by Mission PHC.

The steel beam has been contracted. The retaining wall supply and install contract is in process, hoping to be awarded in early of November.

RECAP: We are moving forward every day. The Land Disturbance work, tree removal, sod removal, sewer line, water line and utility work should begin early November weather, availability and with the grace and benevolence of God our Father.
