PARISH ANNOUNCEMENTS

VOTER'S MEETING Please plan to attend our semiannual Fall Voters' Meeting on **THIS AFTERNOON** at 12:15pm. The primary agenda item for review and approval is our 2020 budget. There will there also be an update from the Building Committee.

NEW MEMBER CLASSES continue this morning during the education hour at 9:30am. If you are thinking of joining our church or just want more information, please join us. It will take place in the fellowship room off the narthex.

THE BUILDING COMMITTEE met on October 22 with Laborers for Christ (LFC), LCEF, civil engineering, the architect, and a potential general contractor to discuss next steps for the Fellowship Hall plans and construction. During the meeting we discussed:

- The building committee will be working to finalize bid documents for the required earthwork. Once completed LFC will be able to solicit bids on our behalf
- LFC will be sending a project manager to supervise the completion of the earthwork.
- A potential general contractor came to meet us and find out more about our project. He will be meeting with the LFC project manager next.
- The Architect has sent a list of questions for the building committee to complete (such as specifics about electrical and audio/visual needs, architectural finishes, and miscellaneous items).
 The building committee will be gathering the answers to these over the next several weeks.
- The church received the loan application from LCEF. The Application will be filled out and submitted so that we may proceed with preliminary construction work (i.e. earthwork).

The Building Committee will meet again soon to further discuss and decide on specific details.
