PHASE 1 BUILDING UPDATE

Should you desire to come check out the building project in person, you must stop by the construction trailer first, for SAFETY purposes, orientation of the activities that currently happening and field and questions or concerns.

Thomas M. Hawkins, Jr. (Project Manager) will escort you around. He recently retired from Burns McDonald after 19 plus years as an Senior EPC (Engineer Procure Construct) Project Manager and is a member at Bethany Lutheran. Saying he knows his stuff would be an understatement. He'll keep you SAFE and inform you of the details on what's happening at the site. His contact information is in the church directory.

Progress forward...

- 1. The tree removal, grubbing and sod removal has been completed.
- 2. The new sewer line rough-in from the City of Olathe manhole to the building is finished (they hammered ALOT of rock out of the ground).
- 3. The new/rerouted gas line is finished.
- 4. The new/rerouted power line may be completed by Thanksgiving.
- 5. NEXT: Waterline was started on Friday, November 20th.
- 6. NEXT: Mass grading and compaction; which includes filling in the current drainage pond, excavating for the new detention structure, grading for the retaining walls and parking lots, and preparing the building pad.
