In addition to professionals there is organizing and supervising volunteers. In the next year, we will also be organizing and outfitting new spaces.

HELPING OUR NEIGHBORS It's always nice to get into bed at night under some nice warm blankets when that cold wind is blowing or the snow is falling outside. We sometimes take for granted that we have a nice warm place to call home. The Salvation Army in Olathe provides a Lodge for families who also need a nice warm, safe place to sleep at night. The Lodge was built in 2014 to replace an old motel that had been repurposed as the first shelter for homeless families in Johnson Co. Each unit has a bedroom with 4 twin bunk beds, an area with a sleeper sofa, bathroom and kitchen area. The Lodge is in need of new twin and full-size sheet sets and blankets. 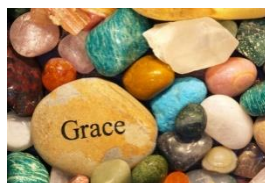

In the Apostle Paul's letter to the Colossians, he lists virtues that ought to be seen in our lives as Christians.
