HOLY WEEK SCHEDULE

Sunday is Passion Sunday (Palm Sunday) (March 28) and the week begins on a high note as Jesus enters triumphantly into Jerusalem amid shouts of "Hosanna!" I encourage you to return to in-person worship. However, if you are still viewing at home, the service will be streamed at the Beautiful Savior YouTube channel at 8am.

Seder Meal (March 29)—Experience the meal Jesus ate with His disciples the night He was betrayed and learn how Jesus takes the Passover meal and does something new by institution the Lord's Supper for us and our forgiveness. Email me now with your reservation as food must be prepared in advance.

Thursday is Holy Thursday (Maundy Thursday) (April 1). This service will encompass all the events of the night that Jesus instituted the Lord's Supper and was betrayed. **Services will be at 5pm and 7pm.** (Service streamed at 7pm)

Friday is Good Friday (April 2) and again through Scripture and song, we follow the events of that day we call "Good" when our Savior took our sins to the cross and suffered and died in our place. **Services will be at 5pm and 7pm.** (Service streamed at 7pm)

Holy Saturday and the Easter Vigil Service (April 3)—This service is the culmination of what is called the Triduum, a 3 part service incorporating Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil. Truly a unique and meaningful worship experience! **Service time is at 6:30pm** (Service will be streamed)

Sunday is the Resurrection of the Lord (Easter) (April 4)—the high festival of the Church Year. Alleluia! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia! Throughout this season of Lent, we have heard a drumbeat call from God to RETURN TO HIM, and on this day we rejoice that this call was issued so that we might have life in abundance through the One who lived, died, and rose again to secure our salvation. We are invited through the proclaimed Word to "Come and See!" and to celebrate the victory won for us. 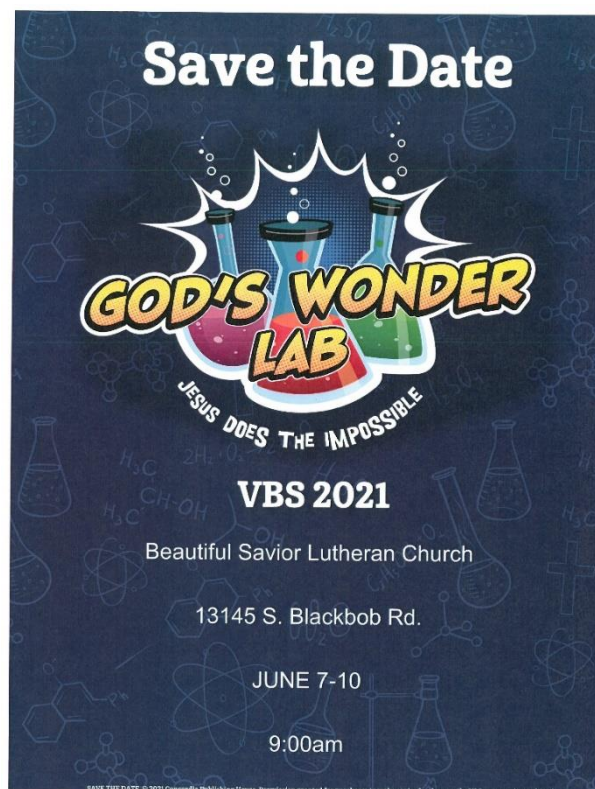
