MIDWEEK SERVICES AND THEMES

- a) March 11 We see the "Sleepy Eyes" of Peter, James, and John in the Garden of Gethsemane.
- b) March 18 We stare into the "Denying Eyes" of Peter and the other apostles.
- c) March 25 We ponder the "Murderous Eyes" of the chief priests and scribes.
- d) April 1 We will be sadly dismayed at the **"Worldly Eyes"** of Pilate, the Jewish leaders, and the Roman soldiers.
- e) April 9, **Maundy Thursday** We see there is **"More Than Meets the Eye"** to the Lord's Supper and rejoice in the mystery that Jesus, in and with, bread and wine, gives us His body and blood in order to deliver to us the benefits of His Passion.
- f) April 10, Good Friday We look through "God's Eyes" to see what is happening during the Passion: the once-for-all atonement for the sin of the whole world and the justification of all sinners on Easter.
- g) April 11, **Holy Saturday -** We look through **"Resting Eyes"**—eyes that rested upon the dead Jesus, cared for His body, and buried it.
- h) April 12, Easter Sunday We gaze upon "Angel Eyes." The angel in the tomb knows the whole story of Jesus' resurrection. When he sees the women, he proclaims the Gospel to them, shows them where Jesus' body had formerly lain, and tells of the resurrection.

WIND SYMPHONY (Concordia University Chicago) The Wind Symphony from Concordia University Chicago will perform a concert of sacred and secular music at Beautiful Savior Lutheran Church and Preschool, 13145 S Black Bob Rd., in Olathe on Friday, March 13 at 7:00 pm. Admission is free. The concert will include Danzon No. 2 by Arturo Marguez, Pines of Rome by Ottorino Respighi, With Heart and Voice by David Gillingham, Jazz Suite by Dmitri Shostakovich, The Seal Lullaby by Eric Whitacre, Lauds (Praise High Day) by Ron Nelson, Symphony V – Movement II "Rain" by Julie Giroux, Alleluia! Laudamus Te by Alfred Reed, as well as the world premiere performances of William Brusick's On My Heart Imprint Your Image. The ensemble, under the direction of Dr. Richard Fischer, has performed in 43 states, Canada, Europe, Asia and South Africa-most recently last May at Carnegie Hall in New York City for the New York Wind Band Festival. The Wind Symphony has commissioned and premiered numerous wind compositions and produced 16 acclaimed recordings of sacred wind music. The concert at Beautiful Savior Lutheran is part of the Wind Symphony's Spring Tour March 6-15 traversing Illinois, Missouri, Arkansas, Texas, Oklahoma and Kansas. THE SINGING SAINTS of Saint Paul Lutheran High School, of Concordia, Missouri, will be performing a concert on Thursday, March 12, at 7:00pm at St. Stephen Lutheran Church, 205 N. Forest Ave, Liberty, MO. The choir is on their annual domestic tour, singing this year in Texas, Oklahoma, and Missouri. The select touring choir is made up of 48 students from the 60-voiced concert choir and they will be performing a varied program that included classic works by J. S. Bach, Anton Bruckner, and Orlando Gibbons, as well as some traditional spirituals, hymns and anthems. They will also be singing two movements from a not-yet-published cantata by David von Kampen, which they helped commission this past summer.
