God commands us to love our neighbors and to express that love through our actions, not because of coercion but freely because we want to do so. Martin Luther describes what our actions with our neighbors should look like. A Christian will "take upon himself the form of a servant...and to serve, help, and in every way deal with his neighbor as he sees that God through Christ has dealt and still deals with him. This he should do freely, having regard for nothing but divine approval. He ought to think... 'I will therefore give myself as a Christ to my neighbor, just as Christ offered Himself to me." With the guidance and the strength of the Holy Spirit working in our lives, we can be the neighbors that God wants us to be.
