July 2021 Summary Report

"Then the rains set in." is how I ended the introduction to the June report....Rain is a blessing and sometimes an impediment to productive construction execution....but this too shall pass. July started much better.

The **1st Floor Slab** installation was executed June 15th with the intention to attack the 1st Floor slab on June 21st the following Monday but the greater Power prevailed and it rained almost consistently until July 1st we rescheduled the placement of the 1st Floor Slab for July 2nd...weather permitting and He did cooperate. The slab placement started a 4 AM and was completed approximately 6 PM. Since the weather cooperated the Bottorff crew also commenced the installation of the RTU slabs, these are the 4 large elevated concrete structure on the east side of the building. The reason for them being elevated is to allow the HVAC ductwork to penetrate the building through metal stud and not through the concrete retaining wall (which would defeat its purpose and introduce areas for moisture infiltration). We also installed an electrical switch gear housekeeping pad next to the North Stair Tower, this equipment is the control and protection of the electrical system within the building.

The **Maintenance Building** was sheeted and dried in for framing, electrical rough-in, and plumbing rough-in inspection. The floor slabs now in place we begin installing the internal building infrastructure, HVAC, interior wall studs (started 7/19), electrical convenience and distribution, in-wall plumbing on the 1st floor HVAC ductwork rough-in.

The **PEMB (Pre-Engineered Metal Building)** structure was completed and inspected. This allowed the exterior structural studding to be installed (starting 7/27). Rock excavation and removal from the site continues. Due to the availability of trucking, the difficulty of the rock demolition and some weather issues, we did not start the retaining wall, God willing that will start in August.

The site will now become a "beehive" of activity with Heavy Equipment Operations, Steel Stud installers, electricians, plumbers, HVAC craft, insulation installers, metal building panel erection, exterior sheeting, window installers, with the rock removal continuing, retaining wall craft, carpenters, masonry, and EFIS (Eternal Finish Insulating System) some commencing in July but most activity in August and months to come.

Goals for August:

- Coordination of all the required City of Olathe and Special Inspections required, which will become more frequent and complicated as we move forward.
- Continue mass grading for, retaining wall, parking lots, and storm water control and detention structures.
- Install Fellowship Building roof insulation, liner panel, and standing seam roofing.
- KD Christian to continue the installation of the exterior wall structural studs and wall sheeting and install 2nd floor interior framing.
- Core drilling of the second-floor slab for the required penetrations for plumbing and electrical installation
- Installation of rough-in for second floor plumbing
- Installation of structural hangers for HVAC ductwork and lighting fixtures on 2nd Floor
- Sprinkler rough-in
- Start and/or Complete the Electrical, Fire Detection, Data infrastructure, and Security and Access Systems rough-in.
- Begin the installation of liner panel on 2nd floor ceiling
- Continuance of interior wall studding (hopefully finishing)

- Pass Framing, Plumbing, and Electrical Rough-in inspections by City of Olathe for the Maintenance building.
- Mobilize Bell Masonry for the west entrance of the Fellowship Building, followed by the masonry work on the Maintenance Building.
- Interior Sheeting and Drywall install in the Maintenance Building
- Receive and install doors for the Maintenance Building
- Mobilize BC Hardscape to start the retaining wall construction hopefully within the first or second week of August.
- Continue re-bidding of remainder of contractors, equipment and material suppliers for the remainder of project: Asphalt, Doors, Floor Finishes other than Concrete Polishing, Cabinets & Counters, Restroom Accessories, Fencing for Retaining Wall, and Kitchen Equipment
- Refine project schedule for the remainder of the project now that known uncontrolled impediments to progress have been address. We continue to address the unknown ones.
- Coordination of the needed Volunteers for construction of Maintenance Building and etc.
