

HVAC CONGREGATION UPDATE #11

Completed Week of December 30:

The structural contractor installed the metal



framing for closing in floor openings and framed new east closets, installed the wood substructure for the

metal coping for the top of the sound wall, and started sheetrock installation on the upper level.

 The electrical contractor roughed in lights and switches for east closets.

- The masonry contractor finished EFIS and sealed and caulked all control joints.
- The HVAC contractor completed installing the new control system, finished all exterior ductwork, continued installing ductwork for the south Fellowship Hall unit, and successfully restarted 2 of 4 HVAC units.

Completed Week of January 6:

- The electrical contractor completed all electrical rough-in for the project and will return to do final connection and installations as needed.
- The structural contractor completed sheetrock installation on alcove closet, youth room closet, north ductwork enclosure, and exterior of the two (2) east closets. We are waiting on approved drawings from the City of Olathe and all trades inspection on east closets to finish the sheetrock. The contractor finished framing in the old duct work floor openings in the new east closets.
- The HVAC contractor finished installing the duct diffusers in the FH and completed alcove duct, set scaffolding in the west stairway and started the installation of duct through the stairwell, and finished installing the new control system. The second 25 ton and 40 ton units were started and operated. All units are considered ready for service.

Work Scheduled for week of January 13:

- The structural contractor will install door frames and doors in the sound wall opening and the youth room closet and start the taping and mudding of the new sheetrock areas.
- The HVAC contractor will continue to install ductwork for the south FH unit.
- The Fire Alarm/Security company will be on site to re-install the final two duct detectors and perform function test of the detectors for all units, and reinstall three (3) fire alarm strobes and function test the system.

FLEECE FABRIC FOR BLANKETS

In January/February, Missions will be collecting fleece fabric to make warm blankets. We will advertise later when the blankets will be assembled (tying) so you may join us if you'd like. It's a very easy process. The blankets will be donated to Orphan Grain Train for distribution to the needy.

- Each blanket uses a 2-yard length of fleece fabric for the top AND a 2-yard length of fleece fabric for the bottom.
- The fabric can be any color.
 Blankets made in the past have used a fleece design piece for the top with a coordinating solid fleece piece for the bottom.
 - (FYI -These blankets are bigger than the blanket "kits" sold in fabric stores.)
- If you only want to donate a 2-yard piece of fleece, that is fine. We can coordinate it with other donated pieces. We hope to be able to donate several warm blankets.

At Two Lines, we provide the information every woman deserves, the healthcare every woman deserves to find, and the love every woman needs to feel. This is more than a name change—it's a renewed commitment to every woman's journey from uncertainty to hope.
