#### **VOICE OF THE MARTYRS PRAYER REQUEST**

Massive Earthquake Kills Pastor and Wife Among Thousands - Turkey

At 4:17 A.M. local time on Monday, February 6, 2023, a massive earthquake shook eastern Turkey and Western Syria. The quake, registering 7.8 on the Richter scale, caused thousands of buildings, including many multistory residential buildings, to collapse. Tens of thousands of people died as a result, and Christians in Turkey's larger cities report being unable to contact their relatives in the earthquake zone. A front-line worker told VOM that one local pastor and his wife, along with their young son, were trapped in a collapsed building. The front-line worker was later told that the couple had died but their young son survived. Front-line workers request prayers for this family and others in the region who are suffering due to the devastating earthquake.
