AS WE GATHER

The Lord God Is Manifested in the Incarnate Son

The Feast of the Epiphany centers in the visit of the Magi from the East. In that respect, it is a "thirteenth day" of Christmas, and yet it also marks the beginning of a new liturgical season. Where Christmas has focused on the incarnation of our Lord, that is, on God becoming flesh, the season of Epiphany emphasizes the manifestation or self-revelation of God in that same flesh of Christ. For the Lord Himself has entered our darkness and rises upon us with the brightness of His true light (ls. 60:1–2). He does so chiefly by His Word of the Gospel, which He causes to be preached within His Church on earth, not only to the Jews but also to the Gentiles (Eph. 3:8–10). As the Magi were guided by the promises of Holy Scripture to find and worship the Christ Child with His mother in the house (Matt. 2:5–11), so does He call disciples from all nations by the preaching of His Word to find and worship Him within His Church (ls. 60:3–6).

Gluten-free wafers are available from the pastor when you come forward.





Constant Abuse for Egyptian Converts - Egypt (12-27-20

The path to Christ for an Egyptian convert is not a smooth one. Nour has followed this road for more than 18 years after coming to faith in 2002. When her Muslim fanatic husband found out, he abused her body with metal tools, leaving scars. He finally threw out his wife, leaving her and her children homeless. Nour eventually remarried and led her new husband to Christ. When her father reported them to the police, they fled to another city, where their teenage children were cursed and harassed in school. When the local Islamists named them as infidels deserving death, they were forced to flee again. Pray for this family's recovery and safety.

Voice of the Martyrs prayer request (1-3-21)

13 Families Beaten, Kicked Off Land - Vietnam

Thirteen Hmong families moved from Northern Vietnam to the Dak Lak province after enduring physical beatings and having their land confiscated. Although Christianity is legal in Vietnam, many in the country, including members of its repressive Communist government, see Christians as a threat. Minority tribal groups like the Hmong often face the most violent and harsh forms of persecution. Pray that these families will remain firm in their faith despite their new environment. Pray that they will find community and share the gospel in their current village, and pray that those who persecuted them will come to know Christ's forgiveness and love.
