FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR SCHULTZ

Now Thank We All Our God

Now thank we all our God with hearts and hands and voices, Who wondrous things have done, in whom his world rejoices; Who from our mother's arms has blest us on our way With countless gifts of love and still is ours today.

Oh, may this bounteous God through all our life be near us, With ever joyful hearts and blessed peace to cheer us And keep us in his grace and guide us when perplexed And free us from all ills in this world and the next!



All praise and thanks to God the Father now be given, The Son and him who reigns with them in highest heaven, The one eternal God whom earth and heaven adore; For thus it was, is now, and shall be evermore.

You may well recognize these words as a hymn that we commonly sing on Thanksgiving Day. In the midst of the COVID pandemic, our minds and hearts can become clouded to the blessings we have from our heavenly Father.

The author of this hymn, Martin Rinckart, lived through a time much worse than we find ourselves in today. He was a Lutheran pastor in the little town of Eilenburg Saxony. Shortly after becoming a pastor, war broke out and raged across Europe, especially Germany, for the next thirty years (The Thirty Years' War – 1618 -1648). Since Eilenburg was a walled town, its population swelled as people from the countryside sought refuge. During those years, the little town was sacked once by the Austrian army and twice by the Swedish army. As a result of the population explosion, plagues and pestilence raged through the crowded streets and homes claiming the lives of at least 8,000 people, including Rinckart's wife. Some days Rinckart would perform as many as 45 funerals.

Living in such sorrow and misfortune, Rinckart kept His eyes on Jesus giving thanks and praise to the Lord for all his blessings! It was during this time, in about 1636, that Rinckart penned the hymn of thanks and praise written above. He had learned, like the Apostle Paul, that nothing in life or death could separate him from the love of God he found through Jesus Christ.

May your life be always filled with thanks and praise to the Lord! Have a Blessed Thanksgiving!

WOMEN'S MINISTRY

Kansas City CrossRoads Fall Zone Event

Thirty-eight women, a guest speaker, and our zone pastoral counselor attended the event at Risen Savior, Basehor, on Saturday morning, October 17. Kim Burdett, Tiffany Harkins, Eden Keefe, and Christy McCombs represented Beautiful Savior.

We heard from Rebecka Noel, the Events Manager and Volunteer Coordinator at Metropolitan Lutheran Ministries (MLM). She explained how their non-profit program – in three locations in KC – is a "one stop shop" for people who are low income or homeless and seek assistance for basic necessities. She focused on their food program (food pantries, sack lunches, and Saturday mobile break-

fasts) and the Christmas Store and how they have adapted to provide services in a safe manner for staff and volunteers. Did you know that pre-COVID they were serving 150 families a week at the Central location food pantry and they are now serving 150 a **day**?

They are seeking volunteers to work "behind the scenes" for the Christmas Store November 20 – December 4, which will be held out of their Central location and done in a contact-less way to protect both clients and workers. For more information, email Rebecka at <u>rebeckanoel@mlmkc.org</u>.

She shared that the top five kitchen appliances for the Christmas Store are: crockpots, toaster ovens, coffee pots, electric griddles, and electric skillets. Other much-needed items are jeans (all sizes), blankets (queen or king – people prefer the larger size so they can double up or cut in half to make two), and \$20 Walmart or Target gift cards for teen gifts. She reiterated that the Amazon wish list is a way to shop and have it shipped directly to MLM. They seek to serve 1200 people this year through the Christmas Store.
