FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR SCHULTZ Advent and Christmas Worship Plan

Dear Friends in Christ,

It is also a great blessing that some have been able to worship in-person for a few months now.

The pastors and elders have discussed worship plans and are glad that for now our worship schedule for Advent and Christmas will remain as it has been in the past with one exception.

- <u>Sundays of Advent</u> (November 29, December 6, 13, 20) remain as each Sunday has been.
- Wednesdays of Advent
 - Advent worship, Wednesday, December 2 at 7pm. This service will focus on the signs of the end.
 - O Antiphon Service, Wednesday, December 9 at 7pm. This service has become a tradition over the last few years and focuses on prayers and Scripture passages which drew the inspiration for the beloved Advent hymn: O Come, O Come, Emmanuel.
 - Service of Lessons and Carols, Wednesday, December 16 at 6:30pm. Through Scripture and song, this service focuses on the prophecy and fulfillment of our salvation found in Christ Jesus.
- <u>Christmas Eve</u>, TO <u>BE DETERMINED</u>. We will be sending out a survey link at the beginning of December to inquire if and how many of your family members are attending a live Christmas Eve service. We will then determine how many services are need to accommodate the attendance. Lastly, because the 4pm service is the most popular and cannot be overcrowded, we will use SignUp Genius to take reservations for the services.
- Christmas Day, Friday, December 25 at 9 am.



Our classes made Thanksgiving placemats and hats to celebrate this year. We thank God for our preschool, our families, and Jesus!












