FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR SCHULTZ **Death to Life**

I love watching movies. I love pretty much every genre of movie. Most movies have a beginning and an end. After you watch the movie, that's it. The story is over. There is *Yesury ection* no more to watch.

That is how many people view life. There is a beginning when we start out in our mother's womb and there is an end when we die. And that is it. There is no life and no more story after we die.



There are other movies, however, which do not end when you get to the final credits. The story isn't over. Rather the story continues in another movie. Movies like the Star Wars saga are good examples of stories that continue well past nine movies in dozens of novels propelling the story decades into the future.

Trusting Hearts Campaign: March Summary Report

We ended last month's report with the statement; "Spring will come with our Lord's blessings. Thanks be to God." Well, God's will, decided to guench our thirst and blessed us with record amount of rain. This rain did cause delay in our progress by at least a week or two.

Early in March we did complete the subgrade and installation of the LVC fill work for the Fellowship Building and Maintenance Building. The PEMB (Pre-

engineered Metal Building) material were received and stored at the east end of the facility parking lot. We also installed a laydown area in the future expansion area to aid construction during spring wet period, however we were not able to get the access road installed to the laydown yard before

fort. Labors for Christ started the preparation at the existing building and the connection between the current Sanctuary and lower hallway at Pastor office by removing the existing siding, architectural fenestration to allow the new construction to be installed unimpeded. This will include removing the existing north window of the Sanctuary reframing the opening to accept a pair of double access door to the new connecting structure to the Fellowship Building. Construction of the detention pond and stormwater sys-






tem structures continues which includes a large quantity of rock excavation and haul off. Volunteers pumped a lot of water to allow the work that was able to be completed. We did have an interruption of our internet service for approximately six hours due to a mistake by their crews, which was remedied with haste. Contracts for landscaping, irrigation, storefront doors and glazing, exterior and interior wall studs, drywall, suspended ceiling, security and alarm systems were completed. Cohorst Enterprises Inc., Bottorff Construction, Needham DBS, are prepared and ready to execute subgrade grading, concrete foundations and slabs, and structural steel erection.

Goals for April:

- Mobilize Bottorff Construction, Inc. for concrete scope including the interconnection foundations, Fellowship Building foundations and the Maintenance Building slab.
- After the foundations cured to specification, mobilize Needham DBS Erectors to receive and erect the first floor primary steel
- Continue mass grading for, retaining wall, parking lots and stormwater detention structure.
- Continue re-bidding of remainder of contractors, equipment and material suppliers for the remainder of project
- Possibly mobilize BC Hardscape to start the retaining wall construction at end of the month.
- Refine project schedule for the remainder of the project now that known uncontrolled impediments to progress have been addressed. We continue to address the unknown ones.


