
When Sunday morning activities or travel occur, there are other options:

May Summary Report

Well, March-May showers, never seem to go away, only grows perseverance, and our craft are great examples.

May started out with confidence and hopes for sunshine. During the first week we mobilized Bell Masonry to execute the elevator shaft and the fire

wall at the connection to the existing facility. The work progressed well with coordination with the Needham DBS contractor Heinen Steel Erection. We received the final components of the Second Floor Pre-Engineered Structure. Heinen had pulled off the site to allow Bell Masonry clear access to their work areas and returned to the site on May 17 with a vengeance...and tough through wet conditions, rain and yes, the muddy conditions, yet Heinen completed the necessary work to allow Bottorff Construction to form and place the east retaining wall and grout the base plates.



Bottorff and Heinen cooperated and collaborated in the stair well area to allow the concrete to be placed in those area, which facilitated the proper installation of the stair pan. And Heinen was able to complete the 1st floor steel, pass inspection by Terracon our *Special Inspector*. This achievement allows the 2nd floor deck to be placed, secured and inspected. Due to this floor deck being a composite designed deck steel stud are installed in the necessary places to allow the floor diaphragm to add to the

structural stability of the entire structure. Placement of the 2nd floor slab is anticipated

to be in early June.



While all this was going on at the Fellowship Building Pad, Bottorff prepared the Maintenance Building slab for placement which was executed May 20. It as a joy to watch the Bottorff's precision, organization and execution of this task. Starting at 6:30 am, forms were filled by 7:20 am allowing the placement of anchor

bolt at the perimeter, tool the edges, tool out the overhead door depressions to prevent water infiltration, then the rough troweling and slick finish troweling, producing a high

-quality product that will be the platform for the

wood frame structure.



The Laborers for Christ received the lumber material on May 21 and began preparation for the framing of the Maintenance Building. A meeting was held with the Member Engagement Group and scheduling of BSLCKS Volunteers to work in conjunction with Mike Crane, Laborers for Christ and Retired Pastor Charlie Adam, Laborers for Christ to plan, prepare, assemble

and erect the frame structure. This structure should be ready for trusses

early in June.

In the background to all the above Cohorst Enterprises continued the mass excavation of the rock laden site. Over a hundred truck loads of rock debris was removed from the site in preparation for the storm water drainage and landscaping retaining wall which we had hoped to begin in May.... but due to the wet condition will need to wait till June. Additionally, it was discovered that the nearly 30-year-old sanitary sewer system had detreated, therefore as a parallel Capitol project, the site team united to revert back to the original concept of tying the existing facility together with the new Fellowship building 6" sanitary sewer. We hope to have this completed as well in the month of May. June is generally dryer than May but not by much, we will individually unite efforts to persevere to bring this project to full fruition. Good Lord, continue to bless us with SAFE and productive project execution for your glory.

Goals for June:

- Prepare and place the 2nd Floor Concrete Floor
- Under slab rough-in for plumbing and electrical in preparation for placement of 1st floor concrete slab.
- Prepare and place the 1st Floor Concrete Floor
- Continue Steel Erection, erection of second floor steel framing
- Coordination of all the required City of Olathe and Special Inspections required, which will become more frequent and complicated as we move forward.
- Continue mass grading for, retaining wall, parking lots and stormwater detention structure.
- Continue re-bidding of remainder of contractors, equipment and material suppliers for the remainder of project, asphalt, doors, floor finishes other than concrete polishing, cabinets & counters, restroom accessories, fencing for retaining wall and kitchen equipment
- Mobilize BC Hardscape to start the retaining wall construction at end of the month.
- Refine project schedule for the remainder of the project now that known uncontrolled impediments to progress have been address. We continue to address the unknown ones.
- Coordination of the needed volunteers for construction of Maintenance Building and etc.




MLM SACK LUNCH DONATIONS




