Sharon was sitting in her pastor's office with tears streaming down her face. Her husband had just been diagnosed with Alzheimer's and Sharon was at a loss on how to handle all the responsibilities of the household that now rested on her shoulders. Her pastor asked her if their estate plan was in place. She hesitated and then said, "We always said we were going to get that done. But now his mental capacity makes it difficult to handle." The pastor shared God's Word with her and they prayed. But both realized the challenging road that lay ahead.

Returning God's Blessings It is faithful stewardship of God's resources to be intentional about putting our estate plans in place. Parents with young children should have a minor's trust

and appoint a guardian in case something should happen. Throughout the years, the estate plans need to be updated to accommodate changes in family composition and life situations. When retirement comes along and investments change, it is time for another review. Those pivotal moments of life should act as a catalyst to move us to intentional action.

Cora tied service to faith in action and said, "Service is a habit ... and this habit is contagious - for *good*!"

The **Farmstead Nuts & Treats fundraiser** was blessed by two Thrivent Action Team cards = \$500, plus orders and donations totaling \$6301. After paying for the items, the profit was \$2,630.88. An additional donation of \$9.12 made it an even \$2640 divided by the six church-work member/students so each will receive \$440. Thanks to everyone who participated!

Charlotte Hundley shared a praise report that the Thursday Morning Bible study group completed 26 **Operation Christmas Child** (OCC) boxes and the Beautiful Moms in Christ group completed 14. Additionally, \$1,113 was donated by adult and children Sunday School classes plus a personal \$50 donation to go toward shipping OCC boxes.

We had a goal of 80 sets of vegetable oil, sugar, and flour for Jesus El Buen Pastor Christmas Baskets in recognition of LWML's 80 anniversary. In total, Beautiful Savior plans to donate 120 sets of the items.
